2003 PROGRAM GRANTS

In three 2003 competitions, the Cultural Affairs Commission awarded 113 grants to nonprofit groups, schools, and municipalities for local cultural programs. A total of \$425,000 in public-private funding was disbursed for activities serving an estimated 470,000 beneficiaries in every town, village, city of Dane County. Grants ranging from \$699 to \$7,000 helped leveraged an additional \$5 million raised by recipients from other sources to support the following programs.
