

AIRPORT MAINTENANCE WORKER II

DEFINITION

Under direction, to inspect, maintain and repair buildings, grounds, paved surfaces and equipment; to operate a variety of tools, equipment and heavy motorized vehicles; and to do related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Primary emphasis is upon carpentry knowledge and skill in working independently to perform inspection, maintenance, and repair tasks or assisting others in the performance of more difficult mechanical, electrical or building trades repair work; occasionally makes work assignments and supervises other employees in specific tasks; operates heavy motorized vehicles, including snow plows and blowers, front end loaders, sweepers, and tractors; performs concrete and asphalt work, painting, plumbing, snow removal, mowing, layout work, inventory and record keeping.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

Education and Experience: Must be able to read and write and have any combination of the equivalent to two years experience in carpentry, using standard hand and power tools.

Knowledges and Abilities: Knowledge of materials, practices, tools, and methods used in building construction, maintenance, and repair; some knowledge of plumbing and heating systems; ability to plan work using sketches and layouts; ability to keep records and make reports; ability to operate heavy motorized vehicles; ability to communicate tactfully and courteously with the public and fellow employees; knowledge of occupational hazards and safety precautions; and ability to perform physical tasks.

Licenses and Other Requirements: Possession of (or eligible for) valid Wisconsin class "A" commercial driver's license. Must be available nights, holidays, and weekends during emergencies.
