

LUBRICATION RACK WORKER

DEFINITION

Under supervision, to lubricate, service adjust and check gasoline and diesel powered mechanical vehicles and equipment; and perform related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Changes oil and lubricates equipment; checks for oil leaks and defective parts; replaces oil filters and takes oil samples, adjusts clutches, brakes, steering, automatic transmission linkages and various belts; cleans and repacks wheelbearings; services hoses, U-joints and related parts, exhaust systems, shock absorbers, wiper arms and blades, batteries, radiator coolant, radiator shutter springs, and hydraulic parts; records oil and lub information and reports condition of equipment.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

Education and Experience: Any combination equivalent to graduation from high school and six months of full-time grease rack experience servicing heavy equipment.

Knowledges and Abilities: Knowledge of the proper use of lubrication tools, hoists, hand and air impact tools; ability to drive light and heavy automotive equipment; mechanical aptitude and capability for learning a skilled trade; ability to follow oral and written instructions.

Special Requirements: Eligibility for or possession of valid Wisconsin driver's license.
